**Intravenous Nursing New Zealand (IVNNZ): -** Unfortunately the COVID 19 travel restrictions forced the postponement of the IVNNZ conference planned for Christchurch NZ in 2020, PNDU are very grateful for the opportunity provided by IVNNZ to have an exhibition stand and the invitation to present the patient/carer perspective at IVNNZ conference in 2022.

New Zealand National Intestinal Failure and Rehabilitation Service (NZ NIFRS): - Unfortunately the COVID 19 travel restrictions forced the cancelation of the NZ NIFRS conference planned for Wellington NZ in 2020.
